





What is it?

Unique Cultural Heritage Collection. Collector and Curator Roberta Bacic. Assistant Curator Breege Doherty.

- Founded 2008
- Physical collection of international textiles focusing on elements of conflict and human rights abuses (371 textiles)
- Online Archive/repository an associated site on CAIN.
- Associated Events (197 events)
 - > Exhibitions/ Tours/ Films/ Participatory activities
- Part of an international network of individuals/ groups/ organisations/ projects that use, promote, and research the textile language of conflicts.






Textiles

- Originated with Chilean arpilleras three dimensional textiles
- Grown to include textiles from over 40 countries
- Some made by professional textile artists, others by complete novices
- ALL have a story to tell, ALL are equally valued within the collection

Textile Language

Bank of Time – Layers of Meaning

- Time to process internally to be ready to make a textile after an event
- Time to plan the textile
- Time to select the materials often with sensitive significance to the topic/person
- Time to sew (allows person to revisit the event)
- Time to reflect
- Then time to put piece in conversation(s)
 with other pieces bring out a response in the other



Social Impact

 Space for survivors and those left behind to tell their stories through textile language - activism

- Allows users the world over to learn about conflict and human rights abuses locally and internationally - education
- Proactive outreach and engagement with communities including those at risk of exclusion
 - Survivors of conflict
 - Migrants and refugees
 - Children
