What is Conflict Textiles?

- Founded 2008
- **Physical collection** of 377 international textiles focusing on elements of conflict and human rights abuses
- Online Archive/repository an associated site on CAIN.
- Associated Events (218 to date)
 - Exhibitions/ Tours/ Films/ Workshops/ Participatory activities
- Part of a transnational network of individuals/ groups/ organisations / projects that use, promote, and research the textile language of conflicts.





Chilean arpilleras: The Pinochet era

- Chilean arpilleras three dimensional textiles
- Contemporary arpilleras originated in
- Isla Negra on the Chilean coastline.
- During the Pinochet dictatorship arpilleras were a means of giving voice to the repressed and disenfranchised of Chilean society
- The practice has spread to over 40 countries globally

- 2008: basic archive web site set up as associated site on CAIN
- 2014 Accounts of the Conflict project includes 10 Conflict Textiles
- 2015 advanced searchable site
- 2017 Colloquium at Ulster University Textile Language of Conflicts
- 2020 Installation of permanent rotating exhibition in the Library at Ulster University Magee campus.
