space. In Autumn 2021, women from Limavady Hen Shed gathered in workshops facilitated by Conflict Textiles, to explore the history and current usage of the workhouse through the medium of fabric. Guided by Deborah they created small arpilleras portraying the breadth of community projects supported through the workhouse at present: a Food Bank, Baby Bank Easter/Spring Festival, Lantern Parade, Christmas Lights and Santa Hut and the Jazz & Blues Festival. Deborah then stitched the arpilleras onto a backing panel attached to a workhouse photograph printed on canvas. Arpillera dolls positioned on the various panels completed the piece; symbolising the intersection of people, community and activities in this historic building -

transfigured for the present era.
