# **Exploring memory of conflicts in** Northern Ireland and across the world through apillera\* textiles 6 October - 26 November **Admission Free**



The process of individuals sharing their experiences of conflict through making apilleras\*, results in a powerful and deeply moving exhibition. This exhibition is the result of a partnership between Causeway Museum Service and Roberta Bacic, who has been the driving force in developing Conflict Textiles internationally, and features apilleras produced by local groups during PEACEIII Cultural Fusions. Visitors and participants are able to reflect on personal memories of conflict here in Northern Ireland, within an international context. These precious memories give an insight into the struggles endured, as well as demonstrating the resilience and courage of individuals in surviving conflict. There will be tours by Roberta and workshops, please see exhibition activities information below.

\*Pronounced ah - pee - air - ahs. These are three dimensional textiles, usually stitched by women, living in or on the margins of conflict.
