The ULSTER WORKERS' COUNCIL WERE INFORMED THIS AFTERNOON THAT THE N.I. FIRE BRIGADE ARE REFUSING TO/INTO PETROL STATIONS MANNED BY ARMY PERSONNEL AND WERE ALSO REFUSING TO PERMIT THE ARMY TO BRING OIL TANKERS INTO THE FIRE STATIONS.

WORKERS WILL LEAVE BALLYLUMFORD WHEN THE RUN DOWN IS COMPLETE.

THE COUNCIL DEFERRED THE CLOSURE OF PUMPLINE STATIONS FOR BELFAST SEWERAGE AND THE MATTER IS TO BE REVIEWED TOMORROW.

THE ARMY HAVE WITHDRAWN FROM THE KOSANGAS PLANT WHICH THEY TOOK OVER AT 5AM TODAY BUT WERE UNABLE TO OPERATE THE PLANT AND RETIRED.

THE ULSTER WORKERS' COUNCIL ARE CONCERNED AT THE NUMBER OF CASES INVOLVING THE ARMY'S FAILURE TO OPERATE THE ESSENTIAL SERVICES.

MEANWHILE MANY REPORTS ARE BEING RECEIVED AT UWC HEADQUARTERS OF PEOPLE PROTESTING AT TENNANT STREET AND A CONSIDERABLE NUMBER OF OTHER CENTRES.
