

In the same year, Irish National Liberation Army (INLA) men Roddy Carroll and Seamus Grew were also shot dead, as was teenager Michael Tighe.

In 1994 inquests into their deaths were abandoned after the coroner was refused access to the Stalker Sampson reports into allegations of shoot to kill.

John Leckey has now been told he can read the reports but he will not be allowed to disclose their contents to anyone without the agreement of the Chief Constable.

Families of the dead men have hailed the news as a positive development.
