Families launch Omagh bomb civil action

The families of the Omagh bomb victims have started a civil action against five men they claim were responsible.

A lawyer for the families described the atrocity as a "massacre of the innocents."

No one has ever been charged, but the five men named in the action today were Seamus McKenna, Michael McKevitt, Liam Campbell, Seamus Daly and Colm Murphy.

Michael Gallagher, whose 21 year old son Aidan was killed in the bombing, said the families believe this is their last chance to get justice.

Talking to UTV`s Ivan Little, he said: "I think it`s proof of the fact that both governments have failed us in the justice system and it has basically been left up to the victims to seek justice for themselves. But we think it is an important regardless of the outcome of the trial."


