## Two released over Paul Quinn murder

The two men who were arrested by PSNI officers for questioning about the murder of Paul Quinn in the Irish Republic over a year ago have been released.

The 21-year-old from Cullyhanna in south Armagh was lured across the border in October last year and beaten to death in farm buildings at Castleblaney, county Monaghan.

Sinn Fein has strenuously denied family accusations that members of the IRA were responsible.

Despite numerous arrests on both sides of the border - several in recent weeks no one has ever been charged with the murder.

The two men were questioned at Antrim Serious Crime suite in Antrim.
