## Man quizzed over Nairac murder

Police investigating the murder of SAS officer Captain Robert Nairac more than 30 years ago

are continuing to question a man arrested in South Armagh.

It's been revealed that the suspect had been living under an assumed name.

Kevin Crilly, 57, was asleep when heavily armed police burst into the house where he was staying in the village of Jonesborough, south Armagh.

He had been on the run since the British army undercover officer was captured by the IRA, interrogated and then shot more than 31 years ago. His body was never recovered.

The suspect is being questioned at Antrim Serious Crime suite.

Six people were convicted for their part in the killing of the army officer.

Five of those convicted were from Northern Ireland and one from the Republic.

But police believe three other members of the IRA gang were involved.

According to security sources, Kevin Crilly had given himself a new identity after returning from America where he had lived for many years.
