Even though one man has been charged with his murder, the McCartney family - who drew international attention with a justice campaign that went all the way to the White House - believe at least a dozen people were involved in the assault.

Others allegedly mounted a clean-up operation inside the pub to remove any evidence.

As the Provisionals came under intense pressure at the time, the paramilitary organisation said it had expelled three members over the stabbing and even offered to shoot those involved.

Sinn Fein later suspended a number of its members.

The detective heading the inquiry, Superintendent Kevin Dunwoody, said tonight that a vicious gang carried out the killing and he emphasised to potential witnesses how he needs their information.

He said: "I would also address my appeal to those who have declined to speak to police in the past for whatever reason.

"I would ask you to reconsider that decision; come talk to me or my team, tell me what you know so that Robert can get justice, his family can get justice and peace of mind and that those who committed this terrible crime can be held to account."

He added: "While a small number of people actually assaulted Robert and Brendan, others helped and supported those in what they did and afterwards.

"So far one person has been charged with Robert`s murder. A number of other individuals have been reported for offences linked to the murder.

"However I still have open lines of inquiry and I urge anyone who was there that night who hasn`t already given a statement to police to come forward now."

The officer also urged a number of drivers who were in the area to speak to police.

"In Cromac Square we know an attack took place at the traffic lights at the junction of Cromac Street and East Bridge Street," he said.

"There were two cars - one blue and one silver - waiting at the traffic lights to turn right onto Cromac Street. We are still appealing for the people in the blue car to come forward and to tell us what they saw.

"They could provide us with invaluable help. We also need to talk to the driver of another car in East Bridge Street that Sunday night who narrowly avoided a collision with another vehicle coming out of Market Street."
