SF seeks Stormont debate on O'Loan's collusion report

Sinn Fein is seeking a debate at the Stormont Assembly on yesterday's collusion report from the Police Ombudsman.

The report says RUC Special Branch officers protected a loyalist gang responsible for up to 15 murders between 1991 and 2003 because its leader was a paid informer.

Sinn Fein has tabled a motion in the transitional Assembly seeking a special session to debate the matter on Friday.

The SDLP, meanwhile, is urging the Ombudsman to widen her investigation and examine how the police handled loyalist informers throughout the North.
