He says young colleagues are leaving the UK in droves, just when they are becoming useful, to join the police in Canada, Australia and New Zealand. One Australian force is recruiting 600 new officers, the majority of them British.</li> <li>Davidson himself has been in Canada to see policing in Alberta. As for the emigration, when even the police start leaving the country, he suggests it may be time to admit to problems.
