	But he told Sunday Life how the Shankill bombing in 1993 was one of the worst atrocities he witnessed.	
	Said 'Paul': "I saw a lot of terrible things during my time here, but the one incident that sticks in my mind is the Shankill bombing.	
	"We went to the area not long after the bomb exploded and it was total carnage. There were bodies and injured people everywhere.	
	"The only thing we could do was try and help people, and find anyone we could beneath the rubble. I will never forget that day.	
	"That was a massive bomb and the people who were present that day deserve great credit for trying to find survivors without thinking of their own safety."	
	He was also present minutes after the IRA bombed the Army's HQ at Thiepval Barracks in 1996.	
	Added Paul: "This was a terrible event too because no-one could understand how the IRA was able to drive a car bomb into the Army's HQ and leave the bomb.	
	"It's a miracle no-one else lost their life that day.	
	"I served in Northern Ireland during a very terrible time and although we witnessed many terrible acts, I can't get the Shankill and Thiepval out of my mind."	
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
