IRA getting away with murder

Statement by Jim Allister MEP:

The recent launch of Walls of Silence, the McCartney sisters' account of the events surrounding their brother's brutal murder and the subsequent cover-up by Sinn Fein/IRA, illustrates that Republican "support" for the rule of law is a sham.
