This exhibition is a satellite of Threads of Empowerment: Conflict Textiles International Journey at the Ulster Museum, Belfast (June 2024 - April 2025).

Threads of Empowerment showcases 29 arpilleras, quilts, and wall hangings documenting conflict and human rights abuses.

Arpilleras, appliqued textiles on hessian backing, became prominent during the Pinochet regime in Chile (1973-1990), allowing women to share and document their stories of violence and repression.
