OUTCOME

The temporary exhibition 'Childhood in a World at War' was the result of two years of team research work within the European Rememchild. The project is made up by a consortium of experts and professionals from European universities, foundations, memorials and museums: <a href="https://www.universities.com/www.universities.

The exhibition was complemented by several pieces of different sources and integrated into the exhibition; on the one hand, seven arpilleras or other textile pieces from different parts of the world belonging to the ConflictTextiles collection based in Northern Ireland. Other 33 works by the artist J.C. Cubino, who collected dozens of broken or imperfect toys. After collecting them; subsequently transformed them into something that makes us think and reflect - wishes to keep wars out of the reach of children.

The exhibition was displayed in the temporary exhibition hall of the Gernika Peace Museum and could be visitedfrom 30 January to 20 April 2025.

Most of the visitors were young French school children. They were the main public we received during that period. They were very receptive to the exhibition as a whole.
