In the context of present flagrant human rights violations, including Palestine, Ukraine, and Sudan, Conflict Textiles, Ulster University, INCORE, Queen's University Belfast, and the Tower Museum are joining forces to present a three-day programme (8-10 December) to mark International Human Rights Day with a programme cross universities, campuses, and cities.
