

COMMITMENT TO CO-OPERATION

Mindful of the fruitful and valued co-operation that has existed between the Museum Service of Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council (CCGBC) and Conflict Textiles and Conflict Textiles Trust for many years,

Including sharing of materials, participating in each other's activities and events, and keeping each other abreast of new developments in each organisation,

Recognising that this relation has been to the mutual benefit of both parties,

Aware that the Conflict Textiles Collection is likely to become part of the Ulster University,

And not wishing that the existing good relations are lost as part of the transfer

We are resolved to make this commitment to future co-operation.

This will mean as far as possible:

- continuing the relationship at the current level or deepening it
- The Museum Services' pieces currently held by Conflict Textiles Collection will continue to be held with the collection until Museum Services wishes for them to be returned
- keeping each institution informed of the other's plans and activities
- participating where appropriate in each other's activities
- lending for display 2 objects from each collection to the other at least once a year
- organising one joint activity bi-annually.

When the Conflict Textiles Collection is transferred to Ulster University contact will be made between the two institutions to plan how this commitment to Co-operation will work in practice.


