# Through the Eye of the Needle

for Community Relations Week 2013

Roberta Bacic will facilitate the screening of this film which tells the story of how Esther Nisenthal Krinitz, then aged 15, and her sister aged 13, survived the Holocaust in Poland. Using fabric art, including stitched captions, she illustrated how she and her sister Mania ran away when the Jews of their village were ordered by the Nazis to report to a nearby train station.

Roberta recently curated the *Stitching and Unstitching the Troubles II* exhibition now on display at The Braid. As part of this Community Relations Week event, she will also lead guided tours of this exhibition which presents textile artworks exploring international and local stories of conflict, similar to those created by Esther Nisenthal Krinitz. This exhibition has been delivered through the North East PEACE III Cultural Fusions project.
