ABSTRACT: The exhibition 'War-Torn Children', curated by Roberta Bacic, is sponsored jointly by Conflict Textiles and INNATE in cooperation with CAIN and the historic Linen Hall Library in the centre of Belfast and runs in the Linen Hall Library until just after the INMP conference. The exhibition consists of arpilleras (two-to-three dimensional textiles which are a powerful art form originating during the Pinochet dictatorship in Chile), photos, posters and other items including children's letters.
