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MEMORANDUM FOR THE GOVERNMENT

Accommodation for Border Units

- 1. It is the view of the military authorities, with which the Minister agrees, that the need for military involvement in Border security, in aid of the Civil Power, will continue for many more years; at least ten years would be a reasonable assumption on present assessments. This rules out the continued use of the existing, makeshift, sub-standard accommodation at Border posts. In any event there is not sufficient accommodation at Border posts in the Eastern Command to cater for the new Border Battalion being established there and its attachments. Irrespective of this problem, replacement accommodation must be provided for the troops in Cavan Barracks which, because of its condition, must be vacated at the earliest possible date.
- 2. The provision of adequate accommodation of a reasonable standard at

 Border posts is a vital and urgent requirement. A brief outline of the

 major works needed to meet the situation is given in the Appendix.
- The cost of the works outlined at 1, 2 and 3 of the Appendix is expected to be of the order of £0.75m. This expenditure will be additional to what is provided for in the Vote for Defence for the current year and will be met from a Supplementary Estimate, if necessary. Likewise, any of the expenditure falling on 1974/75 will be additional to that provided for in the existing draft Estimate for Defence for that year. It is proposed that the Department of Defence should arrange without delay for the execution of these works, most of which would be done by contract and the balance by the Corps of Engineers.
- 4. Because of their magnitude it is essential to engage consultants for the works at Dundalk and Monaghan. It is proposed to engage two ex-Army Officers, Lt Col James Buchan and Capt Charles Ellison, as consultants

for the work at Dundalk Barracks and Mr Thomas Garland, 40 Upper Fitzwilliam Street, Dublin, as consultant for the new post at Monaghan. The Department has experience of the work of Lt Col Buchan and Capt Ellison and the Minister has experience of Mr Garland's work. It is proposed that such additional consultants as it may be necessary to engage as the projects develop will be appointed by the Minister for Defence.

- 5. The Departments of Finance, Justice and Foreign Affairs have been consulted and
- 6. The Minister, having considered the advice of the Council of Defence, recommends that the Government approve the proposals mentioned in paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof.

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Notes regarding other Border posts:

(a) Cavan and Cootehill:

The existing accommodation at Cavan is grossly sub-standard. Approved plans for the complete rebuilding of Cavan Barracks to accommodate upwards of 120 all ranks had to be abandoned because of serious structural difficulties at the site of the existing Barracks. It is now proposed to vacate the Barracks as soon as accommodation for the troops can be made available at another location. The building of a new Barracks as a Company Post in the Cavan area is under consideration (likely cost - £0.275m approximately) but an alternative site has not yet been found; such a post would replace the present Cavan Barracks and the present rented accommodation for troops at Cootehill, which, with 142 all ranks, is over-crowded and the lease of which expires in 1977.

(b) Castleblayney:

Accommodation at this post will be satisfactory when work recently approved is completed. The work is designed to increase and improve living accommodation (cooking, dining, sleeping and recreational), catering for approximately 100 all ranks. The question of acquiring an adjacent field, to be used for recreation, helicopter landing and protective measures, is under consideration.

(c) Longford:

Some improvements are already in progress and further work is provided for in the Vote for Defence for the current year. The approximate strength of this post is 200 all ranks.

(d) General:

When these proposals have been implemented the Border posts will provide accommodation for a total of 1560 all ranks, distributed as follows:-
