NEW YEAR'S EVE MESS. GE FROM THE SECRETARY OF STATE, MR MERLYN REES MP. TO THE PEOPLE OF NORTHERN IRELAND

AT THE UD OF 1974 WE IN NORTHERN IRELAND LOOK BACK OVER ANOTHER YEAR IN WHICH TOO MANY PEOPLE HAVE SUFFERED FROM VIOLENT ACTION FROM WITHIN A SOCIETY DIVIDED AGAINST ITSELF.

I WOULD LIKE TO TAKE THIS OPPORTUNITY ON BEHALF OF THE WHOLE COMMUNITY TO PAY TRIBUTE TO MEMBERS OF THE RUC AND THE ARMY AND TO PAY TRIBUTE MYSELF TO THE PEOPLE OF NORTHERN IRELAND WHO HAVE CONTINUED TO GO ABOUT THEIR ORDINARY DAILY BUSINESS DESPITE DIFFICULTIES.

MY MESSAGE TODAY IS ONE OF HOPE. PEOPLE FROM MANY WALKS OF LIFE HAVE ALREADY SHOWN THAT THEY CAN WORK TOGETHER IN THE INTERESTS OF BOTH COMMUNITIES. WE NOW LOOK FORWARD TO A CONSTITUTIONAL CONVENTION IN WHICH REPRESENTATIVES OF ALL THE PEOPLE WILL SIT DOWN TOGETHER TO SEEK TO AGREE FOR THE GOOD OF NORTHER IRELAND ON THE CONSTITUTIONAL FUTURE OF THEIR COUNTRY. MAY THEY FIND THAT WHICH UNITES THEM GREATER TJAM TJ THAN THAT WHICH DIVIDES.

THE REAL IMPORTANCE OF THE TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF VIOLENCE AT THE END OF 1974 IS THAT IT REFLECTS THE WISH OF EPOPLE OF ALL BELIEFS IN NORTHERN IRELAND TO SEE A LASTING END TO VIOLENCE.

THE MESSAGES THAT ARE REACHING ME SHOW THAT PEOPLE ARE NOT LOOKING FOR A TEMPORARY CESSATION OF VIOLENCE. THEY SEEK A LASTING PEACE. THAT IS WHAT THE GOVERNMENT SEEKS. NOT A PAUSE - BUT AN END.

I SAID BEFORE CHRISTMAS THAT A GENUINE AND SUSTAINED CESSATION OF VIOLENCE WILL CREATE A NEW SITUATION AND NEW OPPORTUNITIES FOR PROGRESS. IF THAT OCCURS THE GOVERNMENT WILL NOT BE FOUND WANTING IN ITS RESPONSE. I CAN ASSURE THE PATIENT, LAW-ABIDING PEOPLE IN BOTH COMMUNITIES THAT THE GOVERNMENT WILL NOT BARTER THEIR SAFETY FOR A TEMPORARY RESPITE FROM MURDER AND DESTRUCTION.

I INTEND DURING JANUARY TO SET OUT MORE FULLY HOW THE PERMANENT CESSATION OF VIOLENCE WOULD ENABLE THE ARMY TO MAKE A PLANNED, ORDERLY AND PROGRESSIVE REDUCTION IN ITS PRESENT COMMITMENT AND HOW ONCE VIOLENCE HAS CEASED AND IS SEEN TO HAVE CEASED IT WOULD ALSO BECOME POSSIBLE FOR THOSE WHO ARE DETAINED TO BE PROGRESSIVELY RELEASED.

I MUST. HOWEVER, ALSO REPEAT THAT THE ACTIONS OF THE SECURITY FORCES WILL CONTINUE TO BE RELATED TO THE LEVEL OF ANY ACTIVITY THAT MAY OCCUR. I AM NOT GOING TO ACT PRECIPITATELY BEFORE I AM CONVINCED THAT THE OPPORTUNITIES ARE REAL AND NOT ILLUSORY. BUT ONCE I AM SO CONVINCED AND ONCE MEN AND WOMEN OF GOODWILL IN NORTHERN IRELAND ARE SO CONVINCED. I SHALL BE READY TO RESPOND WITH THE SINCERITY AND FLEXIBILITY WHICH THE NEW SITUATION WILL DEMAND AND WHICH PEOPLE OF BOTH COMMUNITIES WILL THEN EXPECT OF ME.

MY HOPE FOR 1975 IS THAT THE WILL OF THE PEOPLE OF NORTHERN IRELAND FOR A LASTING RESOLUTION OF THEIR PROBLEMS WILL TRIUMPH.

SIX MORE ORDERED OUT

HOME SECRETARY ROY JENKINS TODAY SIGNED ANOTHER SIX EXCLUSION ORDERS UNDER THE ANTI-TERRORIST LAWS.

THE ORDERS WILL BE SERVED ON SIX PEOPLE DETAINED BY POLICE DURING SWOOPS AT SOUTHAMPTON OVER THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAY.

THEY WERE HELD IN A ASSIVE POLICE HUNT FOR SIX I.R.A. SUSPECTS AFTER THE DISCOVERY OF A BOMB-MAKING FACTORY.

THE TOTAL OF EXCLUSION ORDERS SIGNED BY MR JENKINS, INCLUDING THE SIX TODAY, IS 19. SIX PEOPLE HAVE BEEN SENT OUT OF THE COUNTRY.

FOUR ORDERS ARE AGAINST PEOPLE WHO ARE AT PRESENT ABROAD, IN ONE CASE REPRESENTATIONS AGAINST THE ORDER ARE BEING CONSIDERED AND TWO ORDERS LAPSED WHEN THE PEOPLE CONCERNED WERE CHARGED WITH CRIMINAL OFFENCES.
