The time has come for every Protestant in Ulster to throw their full and dedicated weight behind this Constitutional stoppage.

Let every Protestant ask him or herself the question: "What sort of Ulster will it be if the majority of the Protestant population who are now supporting this strike are defeated?"

It will be an Ulster where Protestants who once were in the majority will be so devastated and humiliated that no longer will they have any say whatsoever in the destiny of their Province.

No section of Protestantism in Ulster can exist without the other. If the majority section is destroyed the minority section of Protestantism will go down with it.

The issue of this stoppage is not Party politics, the issue of this stoppage is a battle for survival. It is a matter of life or death. If you want another seven years like the last seven years - then do nothing. If you want an effective drive taken against the Irish Republican Army and security restored, then join your fellow Ulster Protestants in this final bid to restore peace to our battered land.

"IF ROY MASON CAN BRING IN SEVENTEEN THOUSAND TROOPS IN AN ATTEMPT TO CRUSH A LEGITIMATE PROTESTANT PROTEST, WHY COULD HE NOT, IN ANSWER TO THE APPEAL FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE POLICE FEDERATION, HAVE BROUGHT IN THESE TROOPS TO CRUSH THE MURDER CAMPAIGN OF THE I.R.A.?"
