"Thank you for arranging for Mr Dorr to give me the excellent news of Mr Don Tidey's rescue by your security forces. I am very glad that the persistence, energy and dedication shown by the Garda and the Irish Army during the search for Mr Tidey have been rewarded. I understand that Mr Tidey have been rewarded. I understand that great gallantry was displayed by those who released Mr Tidey. I offer my congratulations to all concerned. At the same time I am deeply saddened to hear that two members of the Irish security forces have been killed and others injured in the course of the operation. I should like to convey my deepest sympathy through you to the families and colleagues of those killed. send to the injured my best wishes for their early recovery."
