CALL ON CABINET SECRETARY WITH LETTER FOR PM

1. I CALLED AS INSTRUCTED ON SIR ROBERT ARMSTRONG AT 3 PM AND SPENT AN HOUR WITH HIM. I TRANSMITTED THE LETTER FOR THE PM. I SPOKE ON LINES OF THE AIDE MEMOIRE AND LEFT COPY INFORMALLY WITH HIM. WE ALSO SPOKE INFORMALLY AT SOME LENGTH.

•2. HE WILL ENSURE FULL CONSIDERATION OF WHAT I CONVEYED. IN THE MEANTIME HE GAVE ME HIS OWN PRELIMINARY REACTIONS WHICH I SUMMARISE BRIEFLY BELOW. A RATHER FULLER REPORT IS ON ITS WAY TO YOU BY ANOTHER CHANNEL.

3. ARMSTRONG SAID THE ISSUE CAME UP IN CABINET HERE TODAY AND THERE WAS A CLEAR WISH TO CONTINUE THE DIALOGUE. HE ADDED THAT HE THOUGHT IT WOULD BE TRAGIC IF WE WERE DEFLECTED NOW.

4. NO POLITICAL DAMAGE HAD BEEN INTENDED. ARMSTRONG HIMSELF THOUGHT THAT THE POINTS IN THE PM'S PUBLIC STATEMENTS TO WHICH WE TOOK EXCEPTION COULD BE EXPLAINED TO SOME EXTENT PERHAPS AS FOLLOWS:

- (A) ALIENATION THIS WAS PARTLY SEMANTIC BUT SHE DOES FEEL THERE HAS BEEN EXAGGERATION AS MANY OF MINORITY ARE WILLING TO LIVE AND WORK WITHIN EXISTING SYSTEM
- (B) FORUM OPTIONS SHE HAS A FAIRLY BROAD BUT NOT VERY DETAILED AWARENESS OF REPORT AND THESE OPTIONS SEEMED TO LOOM LARGE TO HER.

5. THE PM HAD HOWEVER MEANT IT WHEN SHE HAD SAID THAT THE SUMMIT MEETING WAS A GOOD ONE. IT GOT DOWN TO SPECIFICS AND TO HARD QUESTIONS WHICH SHE LIKED - THOUGH TEMPERMENTALLY SHE NEVER WANTS TO MOVE UNTIL SHE CAN SEE A CLEAR WAY AHEAD.

6. ARMSTRONG FOCUSSED SOMEWHAT ON FOURTH AND THIRD LAST

PAR'AGRAPHS OF AIDE MEMOIRE AND ASKED WHAT WE HAD IN MIND? AN EARLY OFFICIAL LEVEL MEETING (ARMSTRONG/NALLY)? I SAID I THOUGHT THIS WAS A GENERAL INVITATION RATHER THAN A VERY SPECIFIC PROPOSAL. THE REFERENCE MEANT IN EFFECT THAT (1) OUR GOVERNMENT HAD CONSIDERED THE PRESENT DIFFICULT SITUATION AND I WAS CONVEYING OUR SERIOUS CONCERNS AS A RESULT. (11) THEY WOULD CONSIDER IT AGAIN - WITH A HOPE I BELIEVED, THAT IT MIGHT STILL BE POSSIBLE TO GO AHEAD (111) THE REFERENCE IN AIDE MEMOIRE REFERRED BACK TO THE REQUEST IN TAOISEACH'S LETTER. TAKEN TOGETHER THESE CONSTITUTED AN INVITATION TO THE BRITISH SIDE TO CONSIDER HOW THEY MIGHT HELP TO OVERCOME THE PRESENT SERIOUS DIFFICULTIES AND ACHIEVE THAT AIM.

7. IN A SUBSEQUENT INFORMAL DISCUSSION, GOODALL CONFIRMED TO ME THAT OUR APPROACH WOULD BE CONSIDERED ''WITH MAXIMUM URGENCY''. HE SAID SITUATION WAS PARTICULARLY REGRETABBLE AS DISCUSSION ON SUNDAY/MONDAY HAD MADE QUITE A DEEP IMPRESSION.
