

Visit of Mr. John Hume, M.P., M.E.P.

- Mr. John Hume visited Northern California on a 1½ day visit from 28 - 29 May, 1985. A copy of his itinerary is attached.
- In the course of his visit Mr. Hume was guest speaker at three major events hosted by the California Irish Forum in Sacramento, San Jose and San Francisco. All three events were well attended and attracted several influential individuals who had not previously attended the Irish Forum.
- 3. In the course of his visit to the State_Capitol at Sacramento, Mr. Hume had substantive discussions (separately) with the three main power brokers Speaker Willy Brown (D), leader of the Assembly; President Pro Tem David Roberti (R), leader of the Senate; and Lieutenant Governor Leo McCarthy (D). All three were deeply impressed and appreciated the opportunity to "hear first hand the one voice of reason and hope in Northern Ireland". (Leo McCarthy)
- 4. Mr. Hume met with several other key politicians including U.S.
 Congresswoman, Sala Burton (D) who introduced him at the Forum dinner
 in San Francisco; State Senator Petrus and San Jose Mayor, Tom McEnery.
 San Jose, centred as it is in the Silicon Valley, is an area of major
 economic importance and is the home base of many companies with Irish
 subsidiaries. I understand that Mr. Hume discussed economic investment
 in N.I. with Mayor McEnery.
- 5. Media coverage of the visit was excellent the San Francisco Examiner (Jim Heavey) ran an editorial entitled "Northern Ireland's Broader Context". The Hume visit was the main feature in the June edition of the Irishman. In addition, T.V. stations San Francisco's Channel 4 and Sacramento's Channel 13 featured the visit during prime-time news round-up. The coincidence of these briefings with the N.I. local government elections ensured that media coverage in this area, at least, was more balanced and thoughtful than might otherwise have been expected in the light of Simn Fein's recent showing in the polls. It also ensured that the SDLP philosophy was adequately reported at a time of heightened awareness generally.
- 6. Mr. Hume also used this opportunity to establish am SDLP fundraising network in Northern California based in San Francisco. In addition to general positive exposure afforded by the Irish Forum functions and related media coverage, two fundraising events were also organized a cocktail party at the home of Maryon Davies Lewis (American Irish Foundation) and a meeting following the Forum dinner in San Francisco. I understand that the fundraising effort was satisfactory although in my view not sufficiently focused. More important, however, was the emergence of a nucleus of fundraisers who intend to continue and develop the effort locally.
- 7. Overall, the visit was highly successful for the SDLP in explaining their position to a singularly influential sector of Irish America; for the California Irish Forum and finally for the Irish Covernment in ensuring that the authoritive voice of constitutional nationalism in Northern Ireland reaches a representative audience.
