Libya/IRA Connections

I discussed this matter with the Director of Military
Intelligence at Army Headquarters today. He has been in
contact with the Garda authorities on the issue (and indeed may
have had some indications from the American side during a visit
there in March). He had nothing really new to say. The
markings on the ammunition boxes found in Sligo/Roscommon and
the fact that the ammunition was Yugoslav-manufactured for use
by Libya do not amount to 'a federal case'. He regarded it as
odd that the boxes were marked Libyan Armed Forces in the
English language. The use of the English language itself is
not surprising, since it is not unusual for it to be used in
shipping designations by non-english speaking countries, but
the normal shipping designation would have read 'country of
Libya'.

The Director was aware of recent talk of money for Libya. He tended to the view, however, that the IRA was showing signs of being strapped for money rather than of having a surfeit of it.
