

PUBLIC ORDER ACT (NORTHERN IRELAND) 1951

Whereas I have reason to believe that it is intended to hold a public procession from Coalisland to Dungannon in the County of Tyrone on Saturday, 24th day of August, 1968, and I have reasonable grounds for apprehending that the entry of that procession into certain parts of the town of Dungannon may occasion a breach of the peace or serious public disorder either immediately or at any time thereafter I, George Ivan STERRITT, District Inspector of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, by virtue of the powers vested in me by Section 2 of the Public Order Act (Northern Ireland) 1951 for the preservation of public order hereby direct that as a condition upon which the said procession may take place the said procession shall not enter or use any part of the town of Dungannon other than Oaks Road, Quarry Lane, Donaghmore Road and Ann Street on Saturday, 24th August, 1968.
