RE: COMPLAINT BY FATHER RAYMOND MURRAY.

Father Murray has, as anticipated, gone to press and complained about being prevented from using a Foreign Language while having a visit with one of his flock.

The visit took place in C Block Visits, an area of Visits, which is also used for Legal Visits.

Father Murray was overheard in the corridor and this caused staff to intervene and advise him that the use of a Foreign Language is not permitted. I have personally examined this area and can report that these cubicles, when in use and the door closed, are not sound-proof. Even when using normal conversation tones the voice can be heard distinctly by staff on duty in the corridor.

In the light of Father Murray's complaints, I have no doubt that a similar situation, ie a complaint about being overheard will arise from the Legal Profession.

I will instruct my Senior Foreman of Works to supply me with details of what would be necessary to bring these Visit Cubicles to an acceptable standard to meet the criteria of 'in sight, but not in hearing'.
