FUNDING FOR VICTIMS ORGANISATIONS

- It has not been possible to get a complete picture of the amount of funding received, or required, by victims organisations. Many groups are protective of their private sources.
- The main funders of victims groups (prior to funding from the VLU) has been the Northern Ireland Voluntary Trust, Community Relations Council and the Northern Ireland Partnership Boards. Over the past three years these organisations have allocated around £1.5m as follows:

- All of these organisations have increased their funding of victims groups in the last 18 months.
- The VLU has allocated the following funding:
 - £50K for pilot scheme (WAVE, Shankill Stress, Survivors of Trauma, Disability Action).
 - £200K seed funding administered by Community Relations Council. To be distributed over 1 year.
 - £3m recently announced, to be administered by NIVT over 2 years.
- The recent announcement of £3m included a review of funding for victims groups after 2 years.
- The number of victims groups dealing exclusively or largely with victims of the Troubles is growing (now over 30) see attached Annex A.
