O'Hagan murder accused gets 'special attention' in prison

LURGAN loyalist Drew King has claimed his close "friendship" with a female former prison officer is the reason why he has been held in solitary confinement in Maghaberry Prison since being remanded last month.



Papers submitted by the leading loyalist's legal team state: "He has a friendship with a female former prison officer named Caroline Murdoch who was dismissed from the prison service. An industrial tribunal found that she had been unfairly

"Furthermore, his father was a decorated prison officer who gave more than 25 years' service to the prison Caged: Drew King who is in solitary service. As a result of this family connection the applicant played in the prison band. confinement at Maghaberry prison

"Accordingly, the applicant does know quite a number of prison officers within HMP Maghaberry personally.

"Guards will open his door and hurl abuse at him directed at Caroline Murdoch, calling her disgusting names."

Barrister Peter Coll representing the prison service refuted these claims saying that King was being held in

isolation as "intelligence" existed to suggest that he was under threat if placed in the main prison population.

"The Prison Service has intelligence to indicate there's a high degree of risk to him from others in HMP

Maghaberry," he said.

dismissed.

This claim was refuted by the loyalist's legal team who said that his co-accused and brother Robin King had been placed within the main prison population without any allegation of threat.

Legal paper's submitted by King's barrister state: "If any alleged threat emanates from loyalists it is inconceivable that the same threat would not exist against his brother."

King, of Moss Road, Waringstown is one of three men to be charged with Mr O'Hagan's murder.

The Sunday World journalist was shot dead as he walked home from a pub in Lurgan, Co Armagh with his wife in September 2001.

Granting leaving to apply for a judicial review of the decision, Mr Justice McLaughlin said there were issues which required further explanation.
