An IRA bullet in the spine at 19

Behind the story

John Moore, from Peterborough, was 19 when he went to Northern Ireland as a Rifleman with the Royal Green Jackets in 1981. Ten days before the end of his tour he was in a covert position near the border with the Republic, hiding in a derelict van in a farmyard near Crossmaglen as they watched for IRA units coming over from the south. But the IRA saw them first.

"I was on stag [sentry duty]. It was a nice summer's evening, the sun was going down. Then suddenly they were firing at us with M16s and Armalites. They were about 150 metres [490ft] away. I could see the holes appearing in the side of the van. I was screaming, angry and upset and fearful. Deano - Lance Corporal Gavin Dean - was shot by two bullets in the initial burst of gunfire. He stumbled out of the van – he was in a bad way. I got out and returned fire but I had no real idea where they were.

"I could see this hedgerow disappearing in front of us. I then ran out of ammunition, and rather than reload I picked up another weapon. I got to round eight when I was shot myself. I was shot in the spinal column, just below the neck. I was instantly paralysed, although I did not know it at the time."

The rest of the platoon, who were nearby, rushed to help, and within five minutes the firing stopped. The wounded were taken to hospital in


