The parents of Paul Quinn of Cullyhanna, who was murdered in Monaghan in October, will attend the Assembly on Monday 28th April at the invitation of Dominic Bradley MLA to hear the debate on the murder of Raymond McCord Junior.

QUINN FAMILY TO MEET RAYMOND MCCORD FOR

They will meet Mr Raymond McCord Senior. Mr Stephen Quinn said they had a lot in common with Mr McCord and they looked forward to hearing about his campaign for truth and justice following the brutal murder of his son.

The private meeting will take place at 3:00PM. At around 3:20 PM the two will meet the press in the Great Hall along with the proposers of the motion, which will be debated for 90 minutes starting at 4:50PM.

The Quinn murder will also be raised at the British Irish Inter-Parliamentary Body meeting in Wexford on Monday, which will be attended by Alex Attwood MLA. Monaghan TDs Seymour Crawford and Rory O'Hanlon have both tabled questions on the murder, which will be answered by Martin Cullen, the Irish Minister for Social and Family Affairs.

Motion - Death of Raymond McCord Jnr

Proposed: That this Assembly notes with grave concern the report of the Police Ombudsman into the death of Raymond McCord Jnr and related matters; applauds the work of the McCord family's campaign for justice; supports the ongoing criminal investigation into these matters; and calls on all individuals and organisations to cooperate fully with the Police Ombudsman and PSNI investigations.
